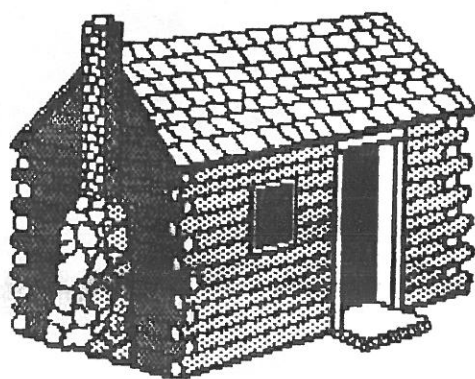

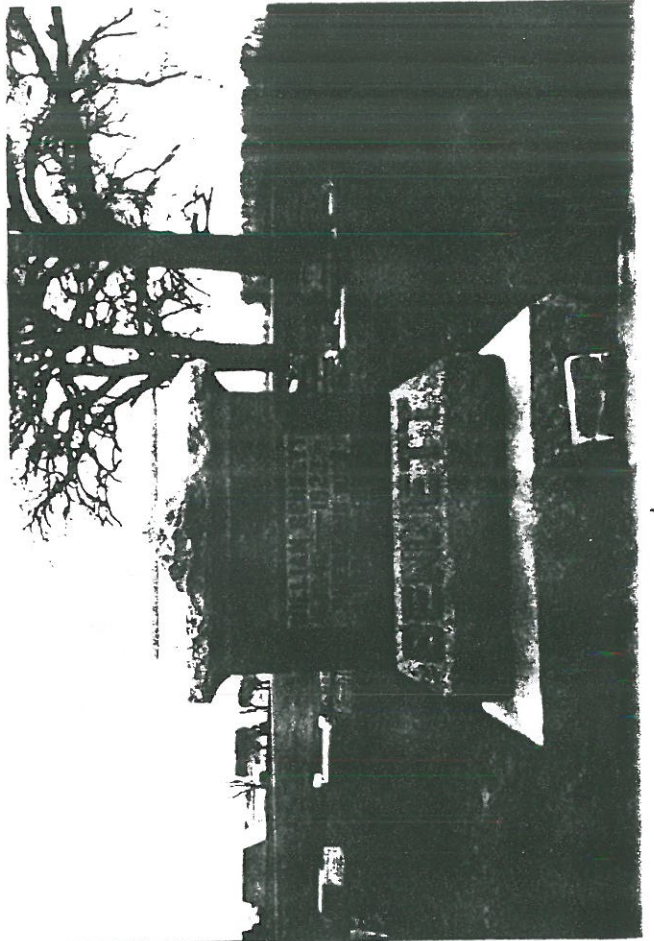

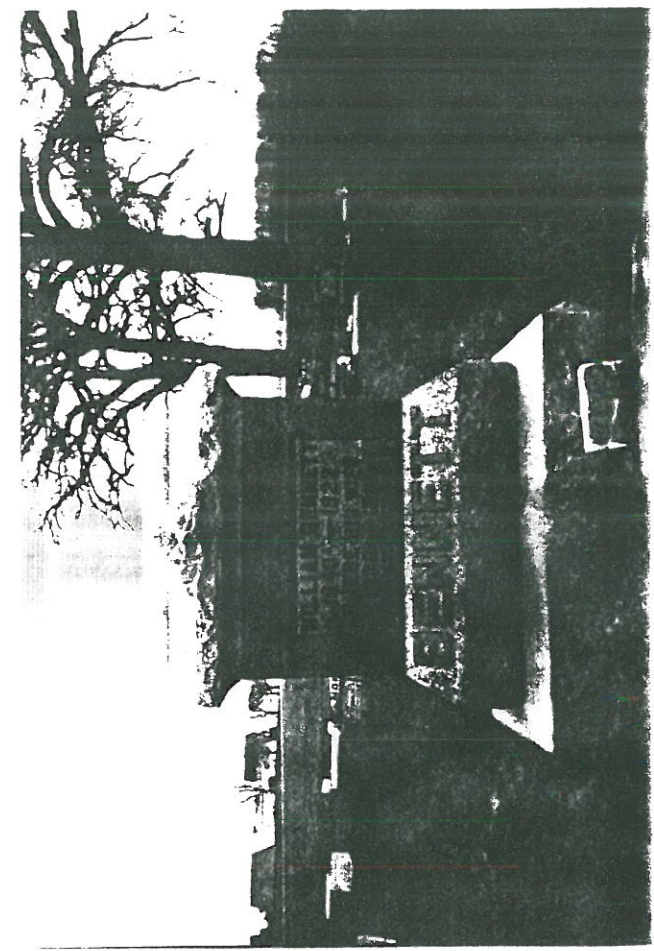

MASONS LAY AWAY BROTHER MEMBER

Members of Masonic Orders of Spencerville and Delphos pay fitting tribute to the life of Wm. Bennett at last sad rites at West Union Church Tuesday forenoon.

Many members of the Masonic lodge from Spencerville and Delphos attended the last sad rites of William Bennett, held Tuesday forenoon, at the West Union church.

Death came to Wm. Bennett at the home of his daughter Mrs. Thomas Rupert, West Union, Saturday morning. He suffered a stroke of paralysis at 6:30 that evening and death came thirty minutes later.

Mr. Bennett was born in Darke co., Ohio, in 1840, a son of Mr. and Mrs. Jacob Bennett. Had he lived on February 22, he would have been eighty-two years of age. On December 23, 1860, he was married to Miss Phoebe Hockenberry and located on a farm in the Spencerville community. He lived there until four years ago when he went to live with a daughter in Delphos. Mrs. Bennett died ten years ago.

Seven children were born to Mr. and Mrs. Bennett. Three are deceased. Surviving are Mrs. Ida Rupert, Delphos; Mrs. Alice Timmons, Marion, Ind.; Mrs. Nancy King, St. Marys, Charles Bennett, Delphos; so twenty nine grand children and forty-two great-grand children; a sister, Mrs. Mary Elizabeth Miller, Spencerville.

January 24, 1869 Mr. Bennett became a member of the West Union Christian church and was an active member until the time of his death. Bennett was a Civil war veteran, listing with 81st Ohio Volunteers, and serving three years with them. He was a member of the G. A. R. and many of his comrades were present at the last sad rites.

Funeral services were held Tuesday forenoon in charge of Rev. L. D. Hammond, of Spencerville, assisted Rev. E. A. Valentine, of Delphos. Interment was made in the West

THOMAS RUPERT

GRAND ARMY OF THE REPUBLIC, an American patriotic organization, consisting of United States armed forces veterans of the Civil War, founded in Decatur, Illinois, during the winter of 1865-66. The G.A.R. admitted any member of the United States Army, Navy, or Marine Corps who had served between April 12, 1861, and April 9, 1865, and had been honorably discharged, and also members of State regiments who had been called into service. The organization, founded for the commemoration of dead comrades, and the practice of fraternity and mutual assistance, held its first national "encampment" in Indianapolis, on Nov. 20, 1866; two years later the G.A.R. instituted Memorial Day.

According to a rule made by the organization in 1869, the G.A.R. was intended to take no official part in politics, but the organization actually at one time wielded considerable political influence, particularly in its support of Presidential candidates between 1872 and 1904, the period during which its membership was greatest. The organization was responsible for passage of the Disability Act of 1890, which doubled the pension roll; it also established old soldiers' homes, and provided care and education for soldiers' orphans. The membership declined after 1890,

when the total was 409,487. At the beginning of 1930, membership was about 21,000, and by the middle of the 20th century few Civil War veterans remained alive.

The first G.A.R. post was created in Springfield, Illinois, with Dr. Benjamin Franklin Stephenson (1823-71), one of the founders, as head of the organization. Its headquarters now are in the State House, Boston, Massachusetts. Encampments were held annually until 1949 in selected cities of the United States, but in recent years few of the delegates were physically able to march in the traditional parades celebrating the event. Auxiliary orders of the G.A.R. are the Woman's Relief Corps, the Ladies of the G.A.R., and the Sons and Daughters of Union Veterans.

VETERAN OF CIVIL WAR IS CALLED

**WILLIAM BENNETT DIES SUD-
DENLY SATURDAY MORNING
FOLLOWING A PARALYTIC
STROKE SUFFERED AT THE
THOMAS RUPERT HOME ON
OLIVE STREET — FUNERAL AT
WEST UNION CHRISTIAN
CHURCH TUESDAY MORNING.**

Although he had been ailing for about a year, death came very suddenly Saturday morning to William Bennett, aged resident of this city. He suffered a paralytic stroke at about six-thirty o'clock and died thirty minutes later. Death occurred at his daughter's home, 810 West Olive street.

Mr. Bennett was born in Darke county, Ohio in 1840, a son of Mr. and Mrs. Jacob Bennett. Had he lived until February 22, he would have been eighty-two years of age. His early life was spent near his birthplace.

After his marriage to Miss Phoebe Lockenberry, on December 23, 1860, he located on a farm nine miles southeast of Delphos and lived there until four years ago, when he came to make his home with his daughter, Mrs. Thomas Rupert.

Mrs. Bennett preceded her husband in death ten years ago next March. Three of the seven children born to them also are deceased.

Surviving are three daughters, Mrs. Ida Rupert, at whose home he passed away, Mrs. Alice Timmons, of Marion Ind., and Mrs. Nancy King, of St. Marys; one son, Charles Bennett, of this city; twenty nine grandchildren and forty two great grandchildren. One sister Mrs. Mary Elizabeth Miller, of Spencerville, also survives.

On January 24, 1869, Mr. Bennett became a member of the West Union Christian church, nine miles southeast of this city, and has been an active and faithful member during all the years following. He served three years as a member of the 81st Ohio Volunteer Infantry during the Civil war. Beside being a member of the Christian church, he was also affiliated with the Masonic lodge and the G. A. R.

Funeral services will be held at ten o'clock Tuesday morning at the West Union church and interment will follow in the cemetery beside the church.

Mrs. Wm. Bennett died at her home near this place Wednesday, March 27. Mrs. Bennet had been in failing health for several years, but her death resulted from an attack of heart trouble to which she was subject. Funeral will be held from West Union church Friday at 10 a. m., and interment in cemetery adjoining the church.

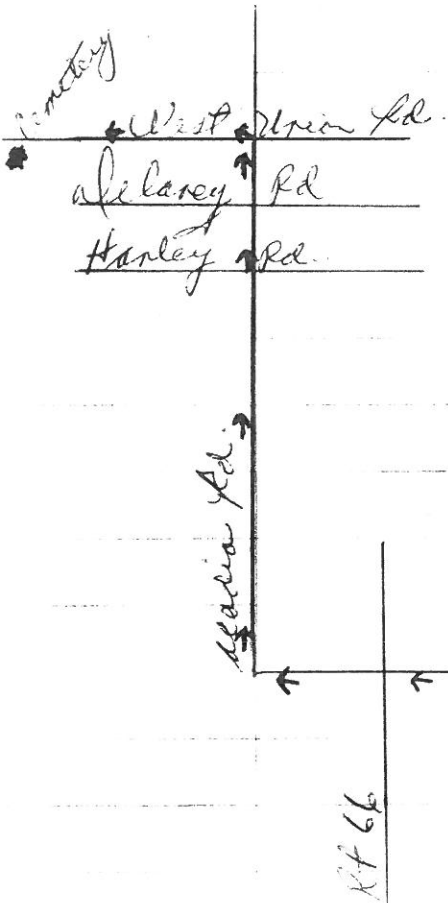
